## **5** Grammar Review

**Aims:** To review and practise grammar from the unit. This can be completed when students have finished the unit.

Time: 15-20 minutes

**Materials:** 1 handout for each group of three or four students

- Divide students into groups of three or four. Tell them you are going to give them a handout with 20 sentences; some of the sentences are correct, but others contain grammatical mistakes. Each group has £1,000 to spend and the aim is to identify sentences with grammatical errors and then 'buy' the sentences they think are correct. Give each group a handout. Students read the sentences and decide if each one is correct or not.
- Start the auction when students are ready. If a group wants to bid on a sentence, one student should raise his/her hand. Bids start at £50 and increase by £50 each time. Each sentence is sold to the highest bidding group.
- The winner is the group which has bought the most correct sentences at the end or, if two groups have the same number of correct sentences, the winner is the group with the most money left.
