## 7 Grammar Review

**Aims:** To review and practise grammar from the unit. This can be completed when students have finished the unit.

Time: 15-20 minutes

**Materials:** 1 set of cards cut up for each group of four students

- Divide students into groups of four. Give each group a set of cards, which they spread out face down in the middle. One student turns over two cards. They try to find matching pairs of cards one card with a direct speech sentence and the other card with the person who would have said it. If they think they have a matching pair, they then transform the direct speech sentence into reported speech. If they make a correct sentence, they can keep the cards. If the cards don't match, they turn them so that they're face down again and the next person picks up two cards.
- Play continues in the same way until all the cards have been matched. The winner is the student with the most cards at the end.
