### **LEARN THIS!** Past simple (affirmative): regular verbs



**a** With most verbs, we add -ed to the infinitive without to:

work -> worked

- b If the verb ends in -e, we just add -d: like → liked
- c If the verb ends in -y, the -y changes to -ied: carry → carried
- d If the verb ends in a vowel and a consonant, we usually double the consonant before adding -ed: chat → chatted
