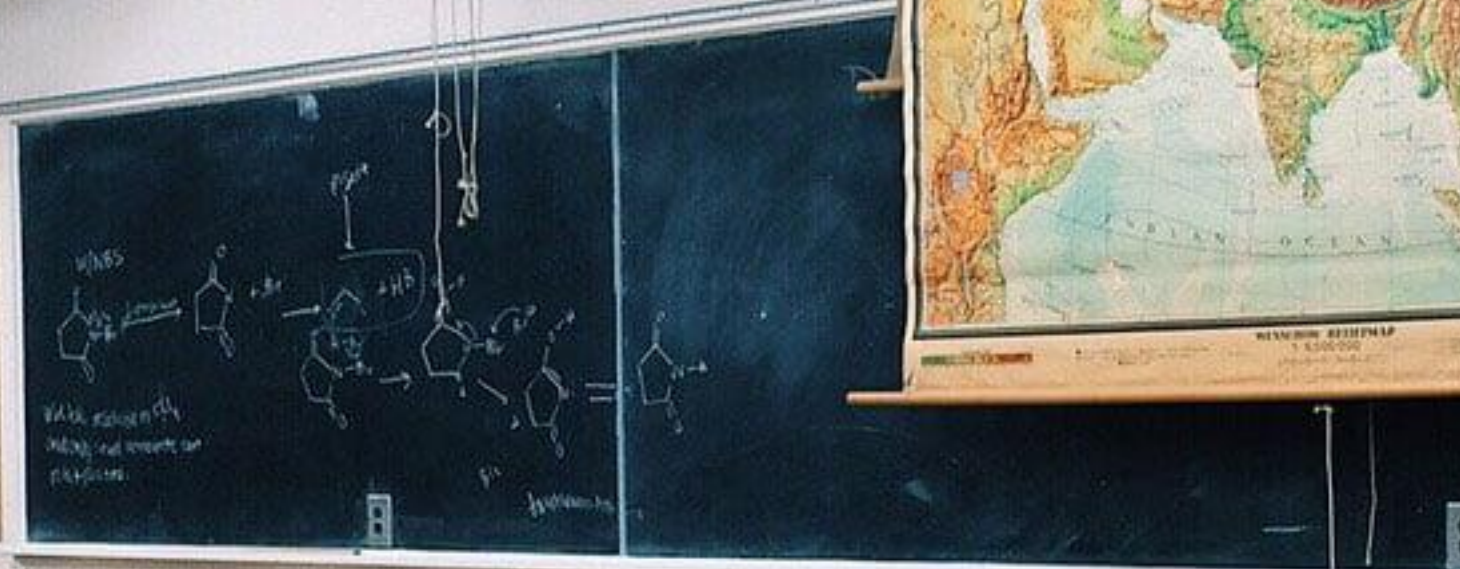

THE BRIT SCHOOL

The Brit School in south London is one of the most unusual schools in the country. As well as teaching the core national ¹ _____ of English, maths, science, computing and citizenship, the school specialises in music, theatre, dance and TV production.
