





- a For predictions, we use:
 - 1 going to when the prediction is based on what we can see or hear.
 - Look at those clouds! There's going to be a storm.
 - 2 will when the prediction is based on what we know or is just a guess.
 - I (don't) think the weather will be warmer next month.
- **b** For plans, we use:
 - 1 going to when we have already decided what to do. I'm going to stay in tonight. I've got the DVD ready!
 - 2 will when we are deciding what to do as we speak. Somebody's at the door. I'll see who it is.
- c For offers and promises, we use will. I'll phone you later. I won't forget.




