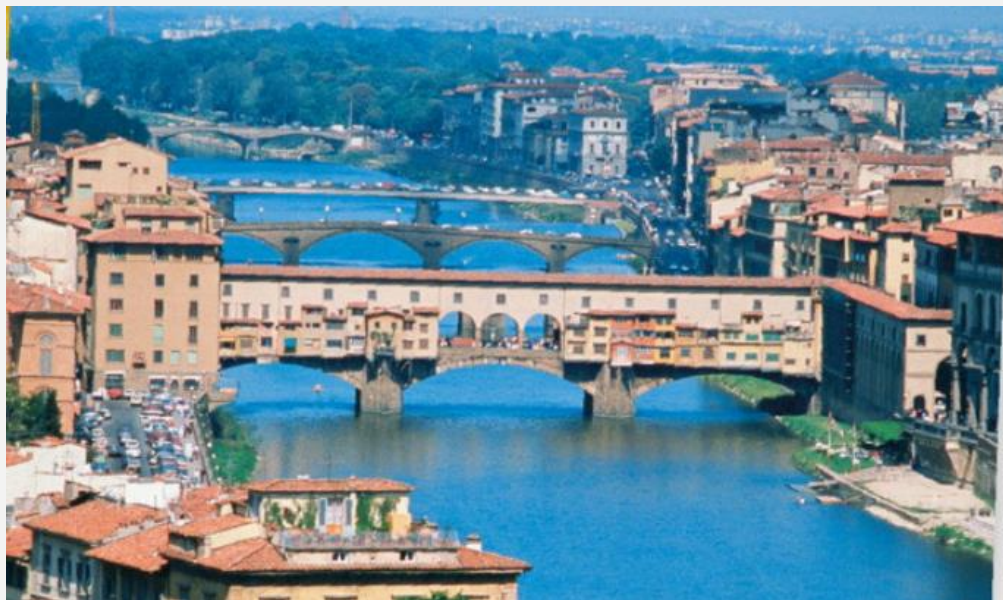

LEARN THIS! Present perfect



We use the present perfect:

- a** to give news, when we do not say exactly when the event happened. *Guess what? I've won a competition!*
- b** to talk about events during a period of time (e.g. a holiday) that is still continuing. *I'm in Paris. I've visited a museum but I haven't seen the Eiffel Tower.*
- c** to ask how long a situation has existed.
How long have you been in Spain?
- d** with *for* or *since* to say how long a situation has existed. We use *for* with a period of time and *since* to say when it started.
We've been in Spain for a week / since Tuesday.

LOOK OUT!

! We often use *been* (instead of *gone*) as the past participle of *go*. It means the person has gone and come back.

She's been to a museum. (She's now back at the hotel.)

She's gone to a museum. (She's still there.)
