AMERICAN WILD WEST




GUNSLINGER Or Gunfighter

• Gunslingers or gunfighters (also called gunmen in the 19th and early 20th centuries) were individuals in the American Old West who gained a reputation of being dangerous with a gun and participated in gunfights and shootouts.




- An outlaw is a person declared as outside the protection of the law. In pre-modern societies, all legal protection was withdrawn from the criminal, so that anyone was legally empowered to persecute or kill them.
- Outlawry was thus one of the harshest penalties in the legal system.


BONNIE AND CLYDE

BILLY THE KID

Billy the Kid (1859–1881) was an Irish-American gunman who became an outlaw in the American West. According to legend, he killed 21 men.
