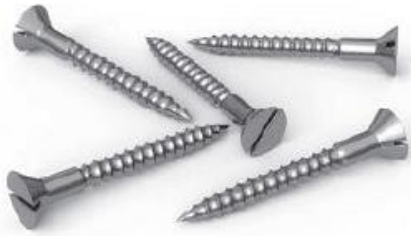

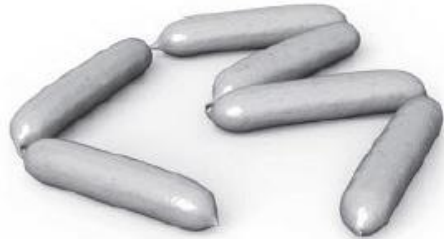

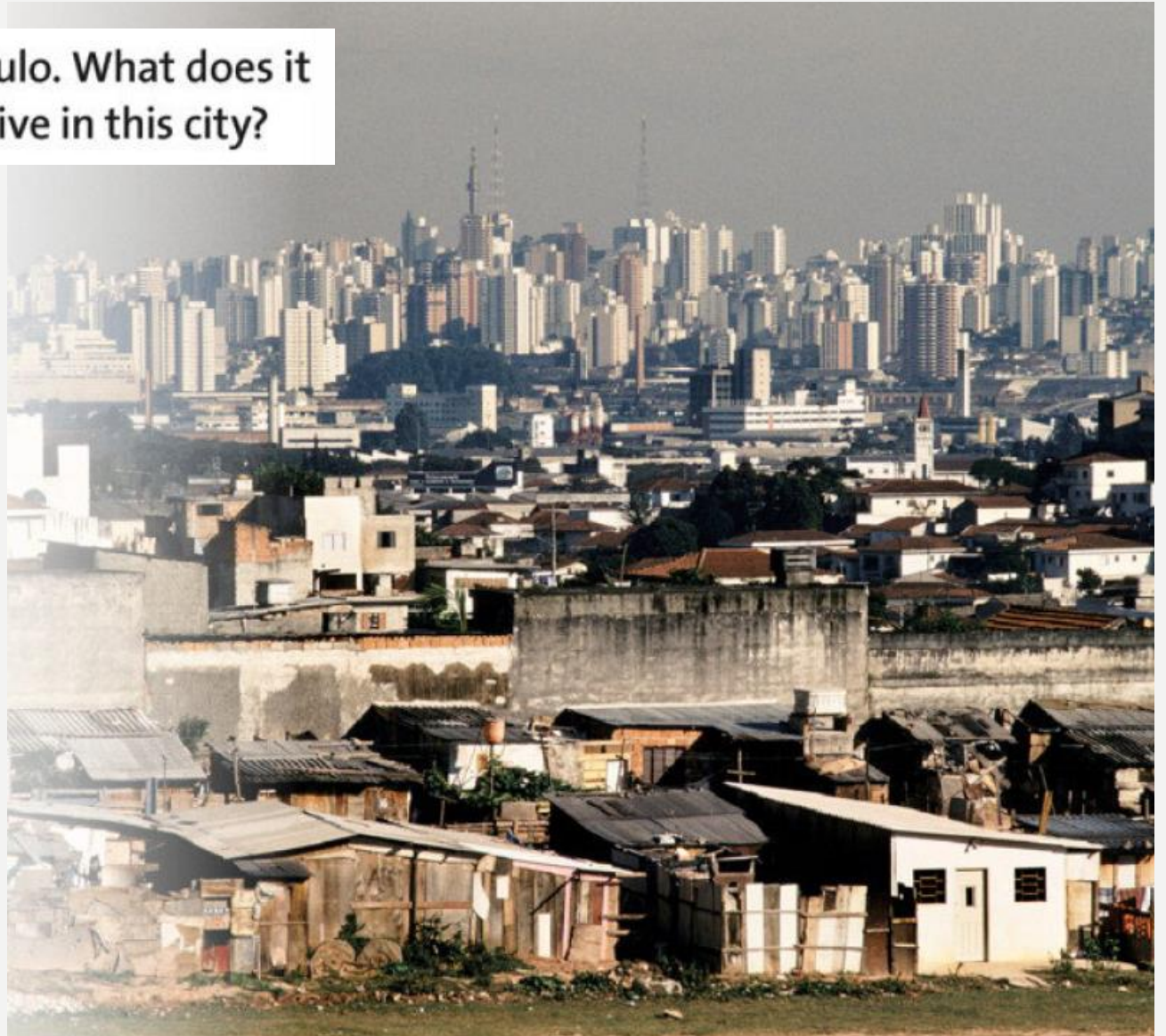

### **LEARN THIS!** Second conditional



- a** We use the second conditional to describe an imaginary situation or event and its result.

If shops didn't exist, we would buy everything online.

imaginary situation                      result

We use the <sup>1</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ in the *if* clause and we use  
<sup>2</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ + <sup>3</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ in the main clause.

- b** We can put the main clause first.

I'd buy you a present if I had enough money.

- c** We use *could* to mean *would + be able to*. It is also the past simple of *can*.

If I won the lottery, I could stop work.

If she could speak English, she'd get a job in the USA.

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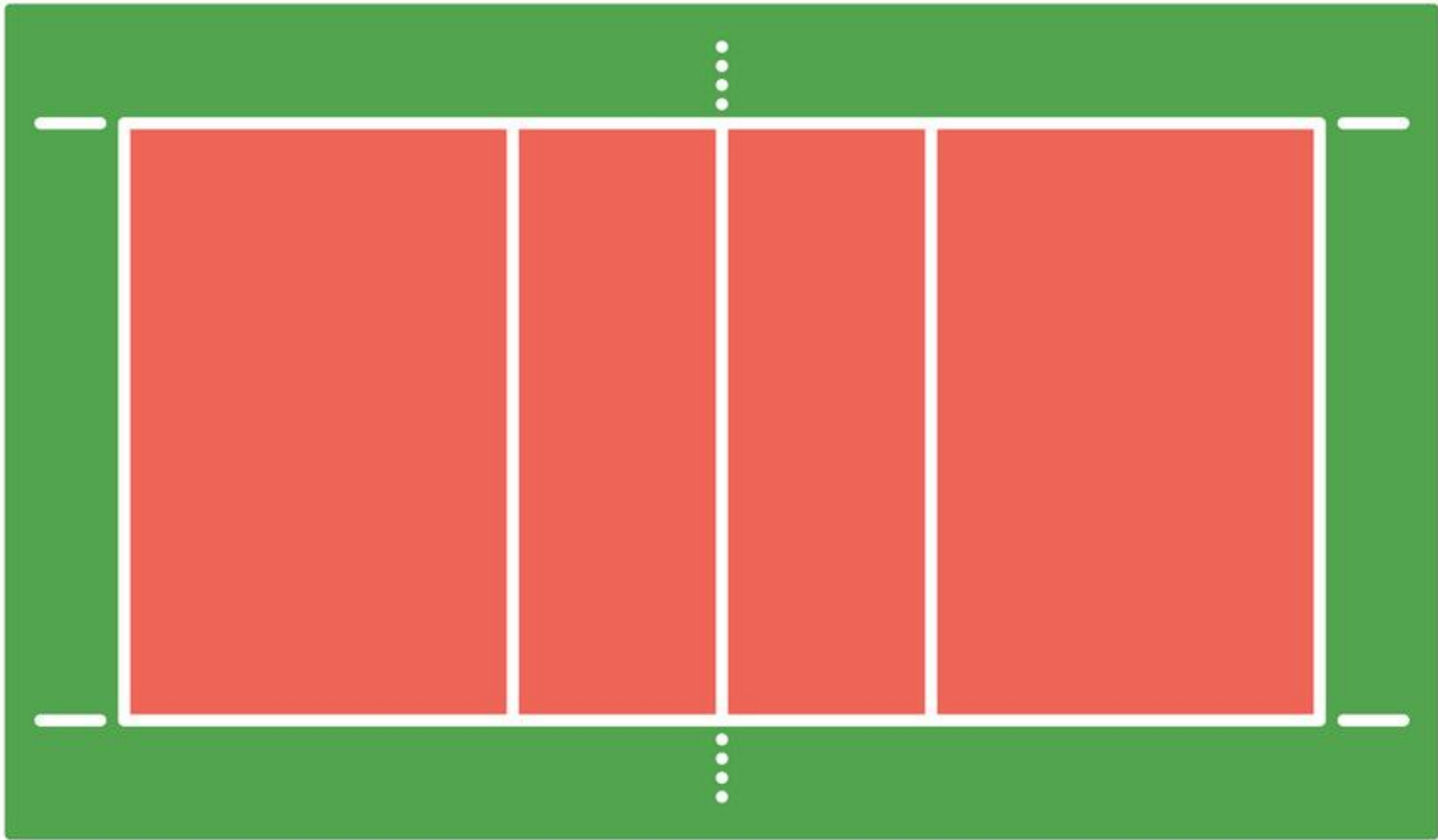
